CHUCK DAVIS, TRANSITIONAL PASTOR - WHITE PLAINS

Jesus is "the founder and perfecter of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2). He is also the cornerstone, capstone and one Lord of the church. He declared his intention for his church, "and I tell you . . . I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18).

The church in America has been through a rough period – pandemic, political division, social unrest. The church local, called Ridgeway, has also endured major internal strife over the past few years. But darkness has not overcome the light. And that light, Jesus, is bringing healing to past wounds and vision for a vibrant future.

In our role as consultants, Ingrid and I have given primary effort to bringing healing to individual members of the team and to foster a healthier team culture. We have also been a sounding board for leadership on decisions in this time of transition. And finally, I have been giving spiritual direction to the preaching and teaching ministries.

Over the course of this next year, we will continue to invest developmentally in the vocational ministry team and the lay leadership of various ministries. Leadership is presently moving to a common understanding on mission, values, leadership profile and discipleship models. These are essential elements to the health of the church:

Mission – what God has uniquely positioned Ridgeway to be and do. Values – the outward working of our organism and organizational culture. Leadership Profile – what is needed in the next lead pastor. Discipleship – our intentional plans for making disciples, Jesus' final mandate.

Other larger tasks before us this coming year include a governance realignment that better serves this size of a church body; system developments that support the mission; developmentally focused self-review process for staff; training opportunities for lay leadership; and a search process for the future lead pastor. There is much more to accomplish, but those broad stroke summaries will suffice for this report.

In a recent communication with you, I mentioned the two aspects of church – organism and organization. My favorite aspect of church is the organism nature. Holy Spirit energized relationships and ministry, both within the body and in outreach to our neighbors. I get charged every day by that engagement. Organization – governance, systems, etc. – is not as exciting to me. But it is absolutely necessary. Failure to organize well, will reduce the potential of the organism's growth. A community embraced by the Father's love, centered on Jesus, and energized by the Holy Spirit, just gets maximized in mission with good organization.

Finally, I commend your vocational ministry team to you. They have kept the faith in these challenging times. They are proving teachable and growing in their own personal lives and ministry application. Continue to pray for us that we will stay on this trajectory of well-being and growth.

DAVY CHU, EXECUTIVE PASTOR

These past twelve months have been a season of transition. Change in our personal lives, and in the church, can be hard. Last year, I wrote that the 2021-22 year was the "most challenging" year of my tenure but this past twelve months brought new levels of testing, professionally and personally. I pray God's blessing on them as a family and may they continue to draw close to the Lord.

Similarly, I'd like to thank Ashley Figueroa for leading us in worship over the past five years. The Lord has gifted her in many ways and she has used her talents to lead all of us for many Sundays. May the Lord watch over her and Benjamin and may she continue to use her gifts to the glory of God!

Dear Ridgeway family,

I want to begin by thanking all of you for your continued prayer for me, my family, and the entire Armonk Campus (including the Little Sparrows Nursery school). Over the last year, we have seen God be faithful to the calling he has placed over this church, and we are excited for all that God will do in the year to come.

Since our last annual report, we have seen an increase in weekly attendance as well as an increase in our weekly giving. Our services have been very enriching as many have come to encounter the presence of God through preaching God's Word, participating in corporate worship, and fellowship of the saints. In addition, by God's grace, The Lord has brought us a few new families looking for a place to congregate. We have also seen several people invite friends who have found a home with us. There have been at least three or more new people in the last few months who came for the first time and had a personal encounter with Christ through preaching God's word. They have all taken a step towards Christ as they have understood him to be their Lord and Savior.

We have increased to 4 small groups over the past year, and we have seen that people have grown in their fellowship with one another and their faith. We have also started a summer series, where more than 50 people showed up to learn more about God's word. This number is very encouraging and shows there is a hunger to know more about God and his word.

Our yearly Resurrection Event was another massive success, with over 250 community members participating with us. The kids had fun, and both parents and kids could learn about the gospel message. Not only were we blessed to see that many volunteers stepped up to be a part of this outreach event, but we also had a meaningful engagement with the community and saw an increase in visitation and follow-up with people from the event.

Despite all the good, we experienced this year, there were some bittersweet moments. As many of you know, Pastor Rachel and Pastor Gio moved away to Ohio this year. The loss is still being felt by many because not only did I lose a brother and sister-in-arms who have been with me since day one, but the church had to say goodbye to two pastors they had a tremendous amount of love and respect for. Thankfully, before they left, we could show them our love and support as we celebrated them on this new journey the Lord has called them on. We also celebrated Pastor Gio's ordination with the Christian and Missionary Alliance which was a joy to be a part of.

By God's grace, we have received two new workers and believers in Jesus onto the staff. Terri Kurland, a current member of the White Plains Campus, has stepped up to help as office manager for the Armonk campus. Jessica Frey, a current member of Ridgeway Armonk, has also come on to staff as our new children's director. I cannot communicate enough how amazing it has been to watch the Lord use both of these sisters in Christ already help raise the level of our Campus in different ways.

Robert Rodriguez, although not as new, has also done a fantastic job with our worship ministry. We have had increased participation from our congregation in worship, both on and off the stage. We have also had many people make Armonk their home through involvement with our Worship ministry.

Please continue to pray for the Armonk Campus and the Little Sparrows Nursery School, as there is always more to do. Pray that we can plant the gospel into the hearts of all the kids attending our school and that the families will also receive the gospel message. Pray that the Holy Spirit would allow these families to

have a transformative encounter with Jesus Christ and that the Lord would continue to add to our number daily. Pray that leaders and workers will continue to emerge and grow as the harvest is plentiful. Pray that the Armonk community would come to know Jesus and accept him as their Lord and personal savior. Summary:

We praise God for his grace and provision for Ridgeway New Rochelle this past year. If I were to capture the previous twelve months in one word, I would choose "sustaining." A year ago this time, I doubted if this ministry would be sustainable due to major head-winds in three areas: organizational support, location challenges, and staffing needs. We have seen God's miraculous provision in each of these areas. We sense a spirit of encouragement and support for the ministry in our organization. We have moved to our new worshipping location at Salesian High School for Sunday morning. We added team members and allocated increased hours to support the ministry. These changes have resulted in our community being established in New Rochelle.

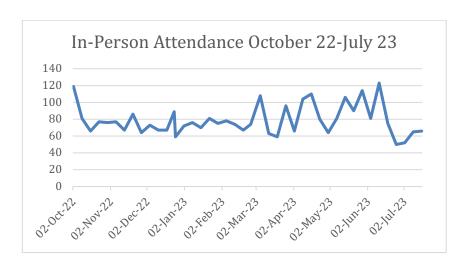
Staffing: I serve as the Campus Pastor of Ridgeway Church in New Rochelle (RNR). This is a part-time role (29) hours. I carry the primary responsibility of preaching, pastoral care, team leadership, and liaising with our Ridgeway leadership team at both central and campus. Titus Sam serves as Associate Pastor over all-things operations from social media management to volunteers' recruitment and behind the scenes mastery of running RNR. Pastor Sammy Lee joined our team in 10/22 to serve as Associate Pastor overseeing worship ministry along with managing our Sunday services. Ms. Blanche Francis serves as the coordinator of our children's discipleship ministry with both elementary and toddler ministry.

Ministries: In addition to our regular Sunday services and children's ministry, we have a vibrant hospitality ministry that is staffed fully by volunteers. We offer coffee and bagel and some special snacks. We are finding that people linger to enjoy fellowship with each other for an hour even after the service concludes. This communicates to me there is something lovely happening: people feel belonging, they enjoy each other's company and conversations, and this is how community is built. Our Ladies prayer group meets on Zoom during the week. Over the summer months we launched a mid-week zoom prayer gatherings for the whole church.

We launched five small groups with 55 participants in the Spring of 2023. Small groups provided the opportunity for our church community to experience the joy of Christian fellowship in shared meals, discipleship in studying God's word and reflecting together, and prayer for one another. We also held a church picnic at Five Island Parks in New Rochelle which was very well attended with tremendous opportunity for fellowship, games, and fun together. We also held a men's breakfast with an international guest speaker hosted at Modern Restaurant attended by 20 men.

Church Community: We have a steady, committed, faithful group at Ridgeway New Rochelle receiving consistent weekly visitors through invitation of members and/or finding us online. This core community has stabilized in attendance this past year due to a more ideal location and timing. For the past three years, we have sustained our goal of "critical mass" which we defined as 15 Families and 15 Individuals. Over the past year, we have exceeded our initial goal of "critical mass," which now allows for a sizeable community presence on Sunday morning despite a regular absence of 30% of the congregation. This allows for belonging, shared relationships, shared ministry, volunteers, and a vibrant gathered worshipping community. I am grateful for a community that is inter-generational, multicultural, and cutting across social class.

Our average attendance from October 2022-July 2023 is 79. In the Spring months, our attendance trended higher compared to the summer months when we have more travels, vacations, and transitions to account. However, compared to this time last year, we have doubled in our summer attendance.



Another group of people that worships with us regularly but are not visible is our online worshippers. We have a consistent viewership of about 20 people that watch our worship services within the first 24hrs on our Youtube channel, and by the end of the week that picks up to about 60 views. Although we do not see them weekly, we hear from many of them regularly that the ministry, messages, prayers, are making an impact on their lives. For this we give God thanks.

Praise:

- 1. We praise God for establishing us a vibrant worshipping community in New Rochelle.
- 2. We praise God for opening a door for a new location at Salesian this past year, for a Sunday morning timeslot, and for ample parking.
- 3. We praise God for a team that is serving together of staff and volunteers who are committed to building a worshipping community in New Rochelle.

Prayer:

- 1. Please pray for courage to share our faith and love with friends, relatives, and neighbors.
- 2. Please pray for visitors and guests to experience God's love in community and be drawn to committed discipleship.
- 3. Please pray that God will provide us a ministry center in New Rochelle. It can be an office space or a house or a parsonage. In the absence of a regular church building, we value a space for office, meeting space for men's group, women's prayer, and hosting small groups.
- 4. Please pray for our community to experience vitality of the Holy Spirit in our faith, Christian affection for one another, synergy on our ministry teams, and consistent member participation in the life of the church.

Dear Ridgeway family,

I want to first celebrate the faithfulness of God in our church congregation since our last annual meeting. It has been incredible to see the hand of God maturing, pruning and leading many in our community.

Here's an update on ministries and responsibilities I oversaw:

- ROOTED: We discipled 50+ new members through our ROOTED discipleship program, including many non-Christians who were exploring Jesus at Ridgeway.
- Life groups: This is our first year since the pandemic that life groups have started. We currently have 100+ people in 8 groups across the county.
- Baptism: We celebrate the 14 people who got baptized in the last year Praise God!
- Memberships: We have 20 new members who have made Ridgeway home after going through ROOTED in this past year.
- Newcomers: We welcomed 50+ new visitors through the newcomer's receptions

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

Earlier in June, I had the privilege of speaking on this passage for the Sunday sermon. It was an honor and privilege to share what God had put on my heart with the congregation. We are surrounded by faithful saints in our church who pour their lives into kids and families, and I am grateful to lead this ministry with these faithful followers.

We regularly use two motifs in Kidz Ministry: Journeying with Jesus and Cultivating Soil. These images help ground us in what we invite kids and families to do and the work we are called to do in our ministry. The message we share is that Jesus is our friend who invites us on a journey of faith that can last for eternity. Scripture points to Him, and we can trust Him because He is faithful. Our responsibility is to create an environment that welcomes Jesus into our lives. As the Parable of the Sower shows, this environment needs to be cultivated like good soil for seeds of faith to grow.

Creating an environment has less to do with decorations and more with presence. We have added to our volunteers to around 70 people who serve on Sundays throughout the year. We average around 85 to 90 children weekly for our 9:30 and 11:00 services. We have toddlers through fifth-grade classes, with around two to three volunteers per class. God's Word is faithfully shared each week, and we pray for more volunteers to share the good news of Jesus with kids and families.

For our large outreach events, we saw an increase in new attendees helping us with the Family Harvest Festival and Easter Celebration. Meeting new faces and connecting with people I did not see on a Sunday morning was wonderful. There were around 500 people in attendance for both events. The hope for these outreach events is to create an experience for our community to feel welcome and loved when they walk through our doors.

The highlight of our ministry year is Vacation Bible Camp. This year's theme was Ready, Set, Move: Follow Jesus Here, There, and Everywhere. We had around 70 volunteers and 170 kids with us during the week. The team of decorators transformed the space into a 3D map with destinations at each station. However, the remarkable moment of the week was when Pastor Mickey asked if the kids wanted to start their journey with Jesus, and around 100 kids stood up and lined the aisle.

While we never fully know the condition of each child's heart, I have learned to treasure those moments. They are the seeds of faith planted in their hearts that will bear fruit. We pray that we will be faithful to water those seeds and provide an environment where their faith can flourish.

In His service Rev. Carl Maiello To the Executive Board and Members of Ridgeway Alliance Church:

This Treasurer's Report seeks to provide an overview of our financial state and a summary of the proposed new fiscal year budget for the period from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024 ("FY 2024"). Responsible stewardship of the resources entrusted to us along with Faith-filled, Spirit-led obedience are the values that helped us through the annual budget-setting process. We are recommending for approval a budget that supports the continued mission of Ridgeway Alliance Church to love God and love people.

Ending the year strong

We planned for a budgeted negative operating margin, or deficit, of -\$250,000 (i.e. the sum of our expenses exceed our income over the defined period of time by this amount) in the current fiscal year.

- As of May close, we were favorable to budget (i.e. we incurred less of a deficit than we planned) and expect to end the year at \sim -\$200,000.
- Giving for the Trailing Twelve Months has seen a 9% increase compared to the same period last year—\$2.1M vs. \$1.9M.
- While this increase and total income is close to budget, expense savings in various categories are the primary drivers of our overall favorability.
- Even through recent market flux and the budgeted FY 2023 deficit, our balance sheet remains strong with enough cash-on-hand to support operating expenses for 6+ months.

Our solid membership base, including observed growth over the last few years, is just one of many reasons for a positive outlook into the new fiscal year. THANK YOU for partnering in the work that God is doing through Ridgeway Alliance Church!

Commitment to God's Kingdom

The proposed FY 2024 budget is an operating margin of -\$161,000, which is another year of an operating deficit, albeit lower than what is projected for FY 2023. As a church with a specific mission, this should be viewed as an investment in the kingdom of God through our continued commitment to the Armonk and New Rochelle campuses.

- Total income assumes a 5% increase compared to the current year, driven by recent giving trends and some proposed rental increases.
- Total expenses are essentially flat with just a 1% increase compared to the current year. This is inclusive of all compensation adjustments and reflects sustained financial support for missions and ministries.

God has always provided for our needs as a church and we believe that He will continue to do so in the coming year. Ridgeway's financial goals are not to grow our reserves or stow away our cash, but rather we trust God to lead the way especially when it comes to using resources entrusted to the church. Though we hope and pray to perform better than budget, our current cash position, including liquid assets in our investment account, will support this proposed FY 2024 budget.

Let's pray expectantly for God to multiply what we bring before Him and give us a vision for how we can each further join in the work that God is doing through Ridgeway Alliance Church. God bless you.

As you know, inflation has caused hardships and stress of enormous proportions upon thousands of Westchester County residents. This pantry began in 2011 in a closet adjacent to the church gym and has grown into the largest, per pounds distributed, pantry in Westchester County. In our past fiscal year Ridgeway Church has distributed approximately 6 million pounds of food and family products to our friends and neighbors. We are fully a volunteer ministry. Not one penny donated to this ministry goes towards staffing expenses. Our Lord has raised up a Ridgeway ministry to serve with gratitude and selfless obedience.

What is the Ridgeway Church Food Pantry? We are scores of disciples of Jesus Christ who follow the calling of Scripture to Love God and Love our neighbor. We lead and sponsor and serve with other churches and organizations throughout Westchester County and do so on a daily and weekly basis:

We also distributed through the Ridgeway benevolent fund approximately \$24,000 of ShopRite gift cards to our church family and neighbors who experience the need for special dietary consideration.

Greetings to Ridgeway Church,

Through your faithful giving to the Great Commission Fund (GCF) and commitment to global missions, we were able to distribute over \$200K in this fiscal year. We continue to support our six direct missionary partners as well as the Christian and Missionary Alliance (CMA) district's Great Commission Fund. In 2022, our congregation responded to the Ukraine crises and funded \$60k in special collections and in 2023, we sent \$19k of earthquake relief for the Turkey / Syrian refugees. In both cases, we have worked through our CMA partners for those displaced and devastated by war and disasters.

We resumed our annual Missions Sunday luncheon on June 5, 2022 and March 12, 2023, in our White Plains campus. There were close to 100 in attendance both times. Our annual event started with the Lao's (Cambodia) and Michele Davis (Senegal NYC metro missions) with a mission minded message in the pulpit. The luncheon included updates from Cynthia Peterson (Share Hope), Laos (Cambodia), Randy Owens, a Ridgeway member on PAAC Pan African medical missions, and Matthew and Ashley Francis (Pioneer missionaries to the Middle east in fall of 2023). On June 5, the Laos also shared in New Rochelle and delivered an impactful sermon on their calling to a new area of unreached people's group in Cambodia. God's timing is always perfect in our planning for missionary updates. Diane McNary visited us in person from Slovak, right when the war broke and we received first-hand update about the need for humanitarian relief in Ukraine. We were able to collect and send funds to the Slovak church, who hosted many refugee families. A little boy who was part of this church and traveled over 3,000 miles alone to reunite with his siblings was profiled in Good Morning America and CNN for his courageous journey.

Highlights in 2022:

- Our partners, Alison and Emmanuel Pothen of Influence International, visited us on May 15.
- On July 15, we gave a one-off support for our young adult leaders: Matthew and Ashley Francis, as they prepare for their plans to reach the Arabic people's group. They plan to leave Fall 2023 for the Middle East through the Pioneer group.
- In October 2022, our Missions Committee chair, Leslie Wong traveled to Israel and visited our missionary partners, Yousef and Merna AlKhouri at Bethlehem Bible College. Leslie received a site tour and met with college staff and faculty. An update was provided to our congregation, as we continued to learn more about the Palestinian conflict.

Highlights in 2023:

- We kicked off the new year in January with Pastor Chuck Davis preaching sermon series for 3 consecutive weeks on missions. Randy Owen gave a video update on PAAC, and Emanuel Pothen from Influence International gave an in-person Q&A update during his visit.
- In February, we launched a special collection for Turkey/Syria relief and were able to disburse \$19K by the end of April.
- On March 6, Missions Committee hosted a dinner for PAAC CEO in White Plains to discuss mission opportunities with PAAC in Africa for medical professionals. 25 people attended the dinner.
- Michele Davis who works with local West African immigrants in NYC was our guest preacher on March 12, Missions Sunday. Afterwards, during our luncheon, we had updates from HOPE Bible Mission on their work in Guatemala, Share Hope in Haiti, and the Francis on their preparation for the pending launch to Middle East.

We continued our goal to create opportunities for Ridgeway members to get to know our missionary partners and to learn about the important work they are doing for God's kingdom. In addition to providing financial support to our missionary partners, we have stayed connected and maintained relationships with them. Each of our committee members serves as liaison for one of our direct missionary partners and brings updates and prayer requests back to the Missions Committee.

Since 2020, the Missions Committee has established renewable 3-year funding commitment directly to those key partners that meet at least two of our four mission objective targets:

- 1. Church-planting among least-reached people or people with limited engagement.
- 1. Work involving evangelism, discipleship, and/or strategically aligned with local church efforts.
- 2. Local leadership development that empowers national leaders.
- 3. Justice ministries to the "quartet of the vulnerable": orphans, widows, immigrants, and poor.

We at Celebrate Recovery are grateful for the continued support, over the past 23 years, from our Ridgeway Church family. Through Ridgeway's support, we meet weekly throughout the year. We will be starting our 24th program year this August.

This year, besides conducting the weekly meetings, 2 individual step studies were in process and another one was completed, 10 participants traveled to Middletown, NY for leadership training in March and we did a mini review of a weekend of the National Summit last July. In June we sponsored a meet and greet in the White Plains sanctuary for anyone who had questions about CR and a video testimony of one of our members was featured at each service.

Celebrate Recovery is a Christ-centered 12 step program. The program was started over 30 years ago at Saddleback Church and has grown to include over 35,000 churches throughout the world. As a Christ-centered program, we recognize Jesus Christ as our only higher power; through the healing power of Jesus and the teaching of His Word we grow spiritually and find freedom from our hurts, habits and hang ups.

Ridgeway Celebrate Recovery is part of the worldwide Saddleback CR Registry which is maintained on the national CR website. We receive inquiries via the registry from the tri-state area.

Our Celebrate Recovery ministry meets on Thursday evenings, during all twelve months of the year. The program offers support and encouragement during the recovery process and encourages the participants to give back as service to Celebrate Recovery, the Church, and the community. The lessons offer new scriptures each week to enable individuals to grow in the Word, faith and knowledge of what Jesus has for their lives.

We give glory and praise to God for the work He is accomplishing in the lives we touch through the Celebrate Recovery ministry. Seeing hurts, habits and hang-ups losing their grip on individual's lives is a privilege to be a part of.

We invite anyone over the age of 18 to come and experience what a program like Celebrate Recovery can do in their life.

JAPANESE MINISTRY

Members Mr. Shinichi Kanai got baptized on July 10, 2022. Mrs. Yukiko Inoue (96 years old), Mr. Mack Araki and Mrs. Urara Kageyama (90 years old), joined our church in the fall of 2022. Mrs. Hiromi Shimba, who got baptized two years ago, and her family went back to Japan for good in June, 2023. Mrs. Chizuko Takada and her family will move to London in August, 2023.

As of end June, there are 14 church members and about ten nonmember attendants, including zoom joiner, of Sunday worship service. Events and activities Gospel workshops and concert, under the direction of Gregory Kelly and Timothy Riley, were held twice (Concert held on Dec.17, 2022 and Jun.17, 2023). 35-37 adults and 37-35 youth members enjoyed praising the Lord, although about two third of them are non-believers.

On Dec.18, Japanese choir members joined the Ridgeway Choir in the Sunday worship. In each workshop on Thursday, biblical message was conveyed to them. One day bible camp (August 24, 2022) and a Christmas celebration (Dec.11, 2022) for children were held and about thirty children enjoyed each event.

On average, we have been doing one weekly bible study on-line and monthly bible study in Hartford.

Our financial status was \$4,275.61 in FY2022 (from Jan.1, 2022 through Dec.2022), but it was because \$6,000 from Ridgeway account for latter half of 2021 came late in January, 2022.

In January 2023, we made a new budget from Jan. 2023 through June 2024 with \$1,416.88 deficit. But because of the rapid depreciation of the Yen and the expected number of church members going back to Japan in the next one or two years, the actual deficit may extend to \$5,000 to \$6,000 in 18 months.

The core and small group leaders have shown a tremendous amount of growth in their walk with Jesus. This has also grown our friendship with one another through continued workshops on our Core & Small group meetings one Saturday per month. The ministry continues to grow in diversity, both ethnically and in age.

With the help of God, we have been able to persevere and spread His Word further through 2023 and look forward in seeking His knowledge and wisdom in 2024 to continue strengthening these men of faith through our Lord Jesus Christ.

WOMEN OF GOD MINISTRY

Women of God has been a ministry at Ridgeway for many decades. We used to hold 3-5 different Bible studies at the same time in different rooms of the White Plains campus. Since Covid-19 we have been doing a single study in two groups, one by phone and one in person. We consistently have averaged 12-16 ladies at each meeting, both over the phone and in-person.

We have been using Bible studies by Max Lucado. We completed two of these amazing Bible studies this past school year titled *Life Lessons in the Book of 1&2nd Peter* and most recent, *Life Lessons in the Book of Genesis*.

We met on Wednesday mornings from 10am-11:30am in both phone and in-person classes throughout the school year (going by the White Plains school calendar). Each class opened up in prayer, had a lively discussion and closed with praying for the requests of each person in attendance. We held leadership meetings with our committee leaders every Tuesday the day before a class; in where we prayerfully discussed how the classes were going, upcoming issues and events, and how we can better serve God and the ladies in this ministry.

Through this past year we held two fellowship events for the ladies in-person. Each time 25-30 people have attended. We prayed, sang songs of worship, shared Bible verses and served refreshments with much needed encouragement to each other and precious time of fellowship with one another. We also spoke of "What they got out of the Bible studies and how God had blessed them". Many shared how the study strengthened their walk with the Lord. While most of these women are Christians and know the Lord; we are delighted to share that we did have a phone person accept Christ into her life for the first time and confirmed to her what it meant to be saved.

God has truly blessed us in this ministry, and we see it in so many ways. We are amazed at watching what the Lord is doing in the individual lives of these ladies including our own lives as committee members and we continually see how He is moving and working in our individual circumstances every day. SOCCER MINISTRY

The ministry experienced a positive start in 2022/2023 with Covid-19 protocols in place until January 2023, including registration, temperature checks and the wearing of masks. The peak attendance was approximately 60 in November 2022 and stabilized at approximately 50 participants throughout 2023.

We conducted our annual struggles survey where <u>Anxiety and Stress</u> were the main topics that the participants needed help with.

We continued our half-time messages with key themes of *Identity in Christ and addressing the survey struggles of Anger and Stress*. We are thankful for guest speakers including Carlos Amaya and Pastor Davy.

The ministry split into two sessions with ages 10 to 15 in the first session and ages 16+ in the second session.

For the first time, we held two Saturday morning Junior Soccer Clinics during the season in November 2022 and April 2023 with 25 participants that ranged from ages 4 to 12 years. The clinics were well received and have been requested for the upcoming season.

This past season was one that saw us begin to minister to younger Children and their parents. A potluck dinner was organized by the soccer mothers for the Spanish ministry service held in March. This was a very successful connection with the Spanish Ministry and is something we can build upon for the next season.

Our main areas to focus on in 2023/2024 are to strengthen the connection of the parents of the younger children with the church. We also need to design our message schedule for the new season and determine how it can be more impactful in bringing the players closer to Christ.

Please continue to pray that our leadership will have wisdom in advancing the ministry and that the Lord will work in the hearts of these young men and their parents such that God will be glorified both on and off the soccer field.
